• Prior to my administrative appointments, I served on a large number of departmental, school, and university level committees, including the Academic Senate. I was the Executive Secretary for the University Faculty Policy Committee from 1981-1994. I was the Executive Secretary for the Library Subcommittee for one year and the Executive Secretary for the Graduate Studies Subcommittee for one year. As Provost, I was chair of a number of University administrative committees, including Strategic Planning and Customer Service Committees. I served on a number of system wide committees, including the CSU collective bargaining team, the CSU-UC Joint Graduate Review Board, the Student Admission Advisory Committee and the Financial Advisory Committee.

### Personal commentary:

I thoroughly enjoined my thirty years at Cal State LA (okay, some days more so than others) but felt that 30 years at institution was enough. This may be a throwback to my father's thirty years of Naval service, where retirement becomes mandatory after thirty years of service. I felt it was time to retire and let younger people take over.

After retirement, my husband and I left California and moved to Singapore where we both worked for a two-year college there that had an affiliation with Cal State Dominguez Hills. After our time there, we moved to Abu Dhabi in the United Arab Emirates where I served as Deputy Provost of Zayed University and was in charge of the Abu Dhabi campus (the main campus is in Dubai). My husband started a higher education consulting business and in 2003 we moved it to Singapore. In the seven years we were in Singapore the second time, we worked in a number of countries as consultants, including Afghanistan, Fujairah, Qatar, Rwanda, and Yemen.

One of my hobbies that I am now able to indulge in is travel. I have visited 76 different countries and plan to continue to travel. I had to temporarily slow down a bit in 2009 with total knee replacements in both knees, but am ready to start up again.

My other major hobby is writing. I have written my memoirs of my first twenty-six years (ending with my earning my Ph.D. and beginning work at Cal State LA). I am currently writing a memoir of my last years in Southeast Asia, tentatively titled *Singapore Slings and Arrows of Outrageous Fortune*.
