Personal commentary:

With the blessing of my husband, Hilard L. Kravitz, M.D., who later served as Vice-President, I founded “Friends of Music” with a handful of friends and colleagues in our home in 1976. “Friends of Music” was established to raise scholarship funds for talented music students. Fifteen musicales in our home showcased these students. Others after me continued the tradition. I chaired Galas in the Grand Hall of the Music Center to honor and establish endowed scholarships for such celebrities as pianist Leonard Pennario and jazz artist Woody Herman. In 1981, with tenor Richard Mc Comb as Director, Faculty/Staff Vocal Extravaganzas became a biennial event. Children of faculty and staff from the entire campus were invited to join “Cal State LA Kids.” These “Kids” and I performed staged scenes like “I Won’t Grow Up” from *Peter Pan* until 1997 when some were already teenagers in “Getting To Know You” from *The King And I*. My fondest memory was performing the part of Frasquita in the “Card Scene” from *Carmen* with Mona Paulee and Pallyanne Baxter. Today, “Friends of Music” continues to raise funds in many ways to award scholarships to our talented musicians.

My husband and I worked hard but we also played hard! We traveled extensively. Every Christmas holiday was spent in Hawaii or Costa Rica with our daughters Julie and Heather. Between my sabbaticals and his medical meetings, we toured Vienna, Salzburg, Israel, the Orient, Seattle four times for Wagner’s *Ring Cycle*, Paris, New Orleans for Mardi Gras, Spain and Portugal, Italy’s highlights including the Orient Express from London to Venice. We drove all over Italy including Rome! We also drove the South of France. Hilard passed away in 2006, but I toured alone the Baltics, Finland and Russia in 2008. Retirement remains busy with opera, symphony, theatre, piano, writing, chess and raising Heather.
