PHI ALPHA THETA





Adam Kendall (MA History, 2020) was hired as (founding) Executive Director of the Oakland Scottish Rite Historical Foundation in Oakland, CA. The library is a museum of thought that exhibits generations of members' interests in philosophy, spirituality, religion, history, and civics. The archive contains three-dimensional objects, correspondence, richly illustrated certificates, photographs, and minute books. Not exclusive to Freemasonry, these records represent other organizations and events of historical interest—including the minute books of the Mexican War Veteran Association, personal recollections from California pioneers, pre-Civil War correspondence, documents from other fraternal orders, and so forth. https://osrhistoricalfoundation.org. Adam is also involved in producing two scholarly journals of fraternal research. The first is Heredom, the flagship publication of the Scottish Rite Research Society in Washington, DC, and the second is the UK-based Ars Quatuor Coronati, which has been in print since 1886 and features some of the best and most reliable essays dedicated to Masonic and fraternal research.



Dylan Williams (MA, History 2022) joined the staff at the **National September 11 Memorial & Museum** in New York City in April 2022. As the Curatorial Assistant, Dylan supports the museum's Chief Curator and its Senior Curator of Oral History in acquiring artifacts and oral remembrances related to the history of the World Trade Center and the terrorist attacks of September 11, 2001. In his day-to-day responsibilities, Dylan conducts extensive primary and secondary source research into new artifacts and oral history subjects, transcribes archived oral histories, compiles artifacts for exhibition rotations, and outreaches with 9/11 family members and other stakeholders nationwide. He looks forward to helping further develop the publicly available online exhibition of the museum's collection, Inside the Collection, and eventually curating his own physical one within in the museum.
