#### Next Steps: The Lesson Plan (LP)

By **August 30th**, develop a detailed lesson plan consisting of

- Pre-class guided activities (following format in Talbert or the guided practice for the pre-workshop activities)
- Detailed lesson plan consisting of
  - Learning objectives, background, and introduction
  - Individual space activities and assessments
  - Section for summarizing, muddy points
- Post-class activities, analysis and reflection

This lesson plan should be submitted to your campus FLC: **Silvia** (for CSULA faculty) and **Victoria** (for CPP faculty)
