
Additional Graduation Requirements

Overall Units to Graduate

Overall Units to Graduate

- Minimum 120 Units to Graduate
 - Maximum 70 units from your Community College
 - At least 50 units from Cal State LA

SCENARIO:



You are not necessarily ready to graduate if you only complete GE and major requirements.

Other Unit Requirements

- Minimum:
 - 40 units in Upper Division
 - 30 units in residence
 - 39 units in lower division GE
 - 9 upper division GE

Eat a healthy meal and exercise at the X-treme fitness center


CSU Academic Advisement Report (CAAR)

- The graduation office uses the CAAR to verify if a student's degree can be awarded!






Three Easy Steps After Logging in to GET



Grade Point Average – Minimum 2.0:




