







#### Undergraduate 22,566




The average study load is 13.2 units for undergraduates, 9.6 for graduates/postbaccalaureates, and 12.7 overall.



#### **HEADCOUNT BY GENDER**




#### **HEADCOUNT BY RACE/ETHNIC GROUP**


